| O | Play Simon Says. | Label items in your child's room or around the house. | Play a game of matching shapes. | Have your child tell a story with a puppet. | Read a book that shows different habitats and landforms. | Hide objects in plain sight and use words to help your child find them. | Let your child select a book to be read to. |
| O | Play rhymes with words ending in "at," "op," "ug," and "ip." | Read a story and have your child repeat words or sounds after you. | Have your child create a picture. Write what it depicts on the bottom of the page. | As you travel, point out signs and what they say. | Sing the Hokey Pokey with all the actions. | Sing the alphabet song while washing hands. | Create a story by cutting out pictures and pasting them to blank pages. |
| K | Have some "me time" and read your own book in front of your child. | Read a book about occupations and provide props to play different roles. | Visit the library and read a library book together. | Help your child create his or her own songs. | Have your child retell a story or event in sequence. | Read a story at bedtime. | Read the same book more than one time. |
